## SENIORS GIVE MUSCLES TO ES THROUGH GIFT

ESHS no longer has a wealthy senior class; a gleam in the eyes of the coaches reveals visions of stronger athletic teams; and girls find a new way to slim waists. All this is a result of a precedent-setting assembly, January 22, where the class of 1965's bank book materialized into the traditional senior gift to the school.

A "Universal Gym Machine," retailing at \$1895, was presented by **Beth Hanson**, senior class president, to **Jeff Peterson**, A.S.B. President. **Jeff**, in turn, delivered a \$1400 check to **Mr. Chuck Coker**, inventor and salesman of the weight machine.

**Mr. Coker** demonstrated and explained the multiple group resistance exercises that can be performed on the machine. Four people can work with weights at one time at the leg, chest, shoulder and pulley stations.

**Mr. Coker** also stated that the Universal Gym can accommodate physical education classes of 45, putting through a complete body workout in a single school period.

**Mr. Nolan Noble**, principal, expressed his feeling at the assembly that "this gift is a testimonial to the mature insight of the senior class. It is practical and will benefit the entire school for many years to come."

**Mr. Noble** also entered a plea for blue chip stamp book contributions by student body members to help pay the balance of the weight machine bill. He donated the first stamp book in hopes other students and faculty members would follow the example.

Stamp books may be turned into the Activity Office any time during the next two weeks.

## Saint Valentine's Day Early Roman Festival

Few people are aware of the connection that exists between wolves and the origin of Saint Valentine's Day, the holiday of sweethearts. Long before the Christian era, the wolf, a constant enemy, roamed the European countryside, killing cattle and sheep, and even menacing farmers and their families. The Romans had a god known as Luperus the Wolf Killer, who protected the Roman farmers from the wolves. Once each year, on February 14, the Romans celebrated the triumph of Luperus by a festival called Lupercalia, a day of great rejoicing. When Rome turned Christian, the holiday was retained, but its name was changed to Saint Valentine's Day in order to honor a Christian martyr who was beheaded by Emperor Claudius in A.D. 270. This holiday became so popular in England that the sending of Saint Valentine's letters began. Later on, these letters were replaced by ready-made cards, a custom which still persists today.

## Torrance Trounces El Segundo Roundballers ESHS Trys To Fill Gap In Last Half of Game

El Segundo Roundballers made a bid against the league-leading Torrance Tartars, Friday night, January 29. The Eagles experienced a disastrous first quarter and an even worse second quarter. The Eagles were outscored 33-10 in the first half.

In the second half, however, the

Eagles topped Torrance 43-32. This was not enough to overcome the first half deficit, and the Eagles fell 65-53 for the final score.

The Eagles' second half spurt was due largely to the shooting and rebounding of Bill Sligar, (16), and a tremendous effort by the team as a whole.

Dana Pagett was the No. 2 man with 14 points. Most of these came on an easy set shot from 20-25 feet.

"We won the first half, they won the second — it's as easy as that," Tartar Coach Will Boerger stated. Many members of the ESHS squad wish the game would have lasted a quarter longer.

Friday night's defeat landed El Segundo with a 2-2 record in league standings, after a win over Lennox and a loss to Aviation.
