

CSF SEALBEARER REQUIREMENTS INCREASED

Mr. Horace Tilton, CSF adviser, has announced a change in the grade requirements for admission to the California Scholarship Federation.

Though previous standards required a CSF member to have at least 1 "B" and 3 "A" grades each semester, new standards prescribed by the state council demand four "A's" in academic subjects per semester. The change governs both semesters of this school year as well as the future, even though El Segundo's chapter was not informed of the new requirements during the first semester.
