ESHS used to have a social club which a student could join for only 25¢ per year.

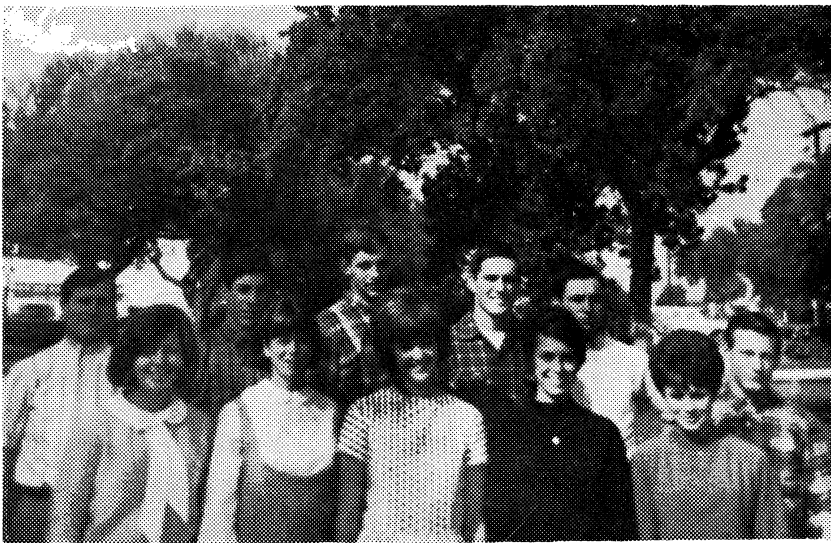
Girls' league once sponsored a "Swoon Crooner" contest, the winners of which were Dick Haymnes, Frank Sinatra, and Bing Crosby.
